Heather Clark is the Board President of First Unitarian Church of Albuquerque Jane Mathewson is the Board President of Woodinville Unitarian Universalist Church

Jane: In the Living Tradition of Unitarian Universalism, the right and privilege of ordination belongs exclusively to our free congregations. 
